If <mark>I won</mark> the money, I<mark>'d</mark> buy the new Iphone.

Impossible in the present! 0 %

If I had money, I would buy a new car.

If mum cooked chicken, I would/could eat it all.

If the weather were good, I would/could go to the beach now.

If I were you, I wouldn't (would+not) tell lies.

If it didn't rain, we would like London.

Unless it rained, we would like London.

If + past

infinitive

• Were instead of was

If I didn't have a lesson now, I would/could cook.(2)-IMPOSSIBLE FOR NOW



But

If I don't have a lesson, I will/may go out tomorrow.(1)->present/future,possibility
