Legendary Creatures of Ireland

Summary

Main Aim(s)

- Introduce students to the fascinating world of legendary creatures from Ireland.
- Raise students' awareness of Irish culture.
- Engage students in interactive learning activities to deepen their understanding of different creatures.
- Encourage critical thinking and cultural appreciation through exploration of folklore and mythology.

Materials Needed

Computer/Projector for video presentation

Learning Objectives

By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

1. Identify and describe various legendary creatures from Ireland.
2. Understand the cultural significance and origins of these creatures.
3. Analyze the special powers or characteristics attributed to each creature.
4. Practice extracting specific information about a topic from various online resources
5. Summarise the information gathered online.
6. Practice their presentation and ICT skills

*The devices can facilitate the process of searching for suitable resources in case of large classes

Lesson Outline

Stage	Steps	Timing
Warm-Up	Begin the lesson by asking the students what they know about Ireland.	5'
	Create a mindmap based on students' answers.	3'
Map	Locate Ireland on the map	3'
Interesting facts	Study the 5 interesting facts about Ireland and explore the resources available	25'
	Ask students to write down one thing they already knew about Ireland, two things they learned from the material examined, and two things they found interesting/surprising.	10'
Task I	The students research information about the legendary creature of their choice according to the instructions.	20'
Presentation and class discussion	Students present their findings and a class discussion on the different attributes of the legendary creatures follows. Ask students if they can think of any references of these creatures in films/books/pop culture.	10'
Homework	Task 2 is to be assigned for homework. The teacher explains the task and addresses any possible questions.	

Notes
